Abstract:	Materials related to Dr. Armando Arias' involvement in the founding and development of California State University, Monterey Bay, as well as academic and administrative documents from Dr. Arias' role as the Associate Vice President for Academic Affairs, Dean of Social and Behavioral Sciences, and Dean of Arts Humanities and Creative Technologies during 1994 to 1999. This material consists almost exclusively of subject files Dr. Arias maintained during this time, but also includes published reports, catalogs, and binders.

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Biographical

Dr. Armando Arias has been an administrator and professor for over 30 years. He holds a Ph.D. in sociology (social psychology) from the University of California, San Diego. Dr. Arias received the esteemed "Faculty of the Year" award at San Diego State University. He moved to Texas to take the position of the Dean of the College of Arts & Sciences at Texas A & M University.

In 1994 Dr. Arias was called to serve as a key strategist and member of the transformation and start-up team that created California State University, Monterey Bay campus on the site of the former Fort Ord military installation. He served as the Founding Associate Vice President for Academic Affairs, Founding Dean of the Social & Behavioral Sciences and Founding Dean of Arts Humanities & Creative Technologies. He currently serves on the faculty of the Division of Social, Behavioral & Global Studies.

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Scope and Contents

This collection documents Dr. Armando Arias' involvement in the founding and development of California State University, Monterey Bay, as well as his role as the Associate Vice President for Academic Affairs, Dean of Social and Behavioral Sciences, and Dean of Arts Humanities and Creative Technologies during 1994 to 1999. This material consists almost exclusively of subject files Dr. Arias maintained during this time, but also includes published reports, catalogs, and binders.

The collection includes materials from other CSU campuses used as reference during the planning of CSUMB. It also includes correspondence related to the development of the university's structural organization, academic programs, and curriculum; faculty-related files; memos, correspondence, and reports from the CSU Chancellor's Office and Board of Trustees; materials from meetings and conferences; documents related to research and collaboration with various organizations and regional colleges; and administrative files.
