# A Message from the President ...

Welcome to the first issue of your alumni association newsletter. # CLEAR CREDENTIAL COURSES

As most of you teachers out there know, when you graduated from CSUMB, you received your preliminary credential. In order to obtain your "clear" credential, you must take Mainstreaming, Health Education & CPR, and Computers in the Schools within a five year period. Some of you were able to take a course or two via video, but now CSUMB's Distributed Learning and Extended Education (DLEE) is offering all three courses each semester LIVE! ED 550 Health Education was taught this summer by Dr. Denise Smith and ED 560 Mainstreaming was taught by Dr. Marcias Karwas. The Computers in the Schools was taught by Harry Powell at the Monterey County Office of Education. The three courses will be offered again through Extended Education in the Fall 1999 and also in the Spring of 2000.

# READING INSTITUTE: "RESULTS"

On July 5-9, 1999 over one hundred teachers gathered at CSU Monterey Bay in the new University Center for professional development in reading as part of Governor Davis' Reading Initiative plan.
