Good News!! Lydia Marinez, CSUMB's Credential Analyst shares this with all: "The California Commission on Teacher Credentialing has just announced that the fees for credential applications that are received by the Commission between July 1, 1999, and June 30, 2000, have been WAIVED!

For applications that have already been received, the Commission will issue a refund to the applicant. This means that applicants applying for the first time for a Multiple Subject Teaching Credential do not need to submit the application fee. It does NOT apply to the applicants internships upgrading from preliminary to professional clear credential.
