

As a Californial Coastal Commissioner, Rusty Areias is in constant battle with exremists who would turn the Commission into a rubber stamp for rampant development schemes.


Rusty helped created the Monterey Bay Marine Sanctuary, the California Ocean Resources Management Program, and the Delta Protection Act.
