

For the Environment...


- Sam Farr brought the Clinton Administration and leaders in marine conservation to the Monterey Bay for the first ever National Ocean Conference.
- Sam Farr extended the ban on offshore oil drilling and convinced the Administration to impose the moratorium for another 10 years, minimum.
- Sam Farr wrote the Oceans Act of 1997, now on its way to becoming law.
- Sam Farr increased funding to the marine sanctuary program and the estuarine research program, both critical to the marine ecosystem of the Central Coast.
- Sam Farr introduced legislation to protect the California Rocks Islands and Pinnacles Wilderness.
- · Sam Farr supports strong Clean Water, Clean Air, and Superfund laws.
- Sam Farr opposes reckless logging of the national forests.

Sam Farr was instrumental in getting the USDA to revise its organic labeling regulation. In its place will be a standard more similar to the standard used currently in California.

 Sam Farr arranged for the federal funding that built critical water delivery systems for local farmers, including the Castroville Seawater Intrusion project and the Salinas Valley Reclamation project.


- Sam Farr is leading the fight against tariff-free imports of cut flowers from Colombia.
- Sam Farr has secured a lettuce breeder scientist for the Salinas Agriculture Research Station.

For Safe Communities...

- Sam Farr worked to put more police on the streets. Through the federal COPS program,
 Monterey County has received more than \$4.4 million to support over 66 police, San Benito
 County has received \$150,000 to support 2 new police; and Santa Cruz County has received \$3.5 million to support over 49 police slots.
- Sam Farr supports programs like Peace Builders and Barrios Unidos which provide kids with alternatives to gang involvement.
- Sam Farr supports the Domestic Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) which seeks to protect women and their children from abusive home situations.



- Sam Farr has been pivotal in securing funding to advance educational
 opportunities in the district. CSUMB has received over \$50 million and
 UCSC has received another \$2 million in federal funds as a result of Farr's
 efforts. DLI and NPS continue to benefit from Farr's interaction with federal
 military educators at the Pentagon.
- Sam Farr cut the red tape that was holding up establishment and construction of a new marine research laboratory in Santa Cruz. Farr and administration officials broke ground for this new \$20 million educational facility in June, 1998.
- Sam Farr voted for increases in Pell Grants, and for lower interest rates on student loans. He supports tax credits for families with children in school.
- Sam Farr supports federal funding to underwrite local bonds for the repair and construction of school buildings.



For the Economy...



- Thanks to Sam Farr, the old Silas B. Hayes hospital at Fort Ord was converted to federal office space. This brought 300 jobs to the area.
- Sam Farr saved the local Social Security Data Center from being closed and contracted out to another part of the country. This saved another 300 local jobs.
- Sam Farr has been tireless in assisting local residents and businesses to receive emergency funds to re-shape their lives after a natural disaster; like the Loma Prieta earthquake, the 1995 floods, and the El Niño of 1997.
- Sam Farr formed the Travel & Tourism Caucus in the House of Representatives to focus on those federal policies that impact tourism—the Central Coast's second largest industry.
- Sam Farr supported a cut in the capital gains tax and voted to raise the loan cap on federally insured home mortgages.
- Sam Farr has obtained over \$12 million in new highway construction funds, including a new interchange at Airport
 Road/Highway 101; a Highway 25 By-Pass of downtown Hollister; environmental studies for the Route 101 Prunedale By-Pass,
 and improvements for highway crossings along the Monterey Branch line railroad. Farr has also secured funds for buses in both
 Monterey and Santa Cruz counties.
