Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United Preemption States of America in Congress assembled, That the preemption laws laws extended of the United States, as they now exist, be and they are hereby extended served or to be over the alternate reserved sections of public lands along the lines of all reserved on lines the railroads in the United States wherever public lands have been or may be granted by acts of Congress; and that it shall be the privilege of the persons residing on any of said reserved lands to pay for the same in soldiers' bounty land warrants, estimated at a dollar and twentyfive cents per acre, or in gold and silver, or both together, in preference to any other person, and at any time before the same shall be offered for sale at auction: *Provided*, That no person shall be entitled to the benefit of this act who has not settled and improved, or shall not settle and improve, such lands prior to the final allotment of the alternate sections to such railroads by the General Land Office: And provided further, That the price to be paid shall in all cases be two dollars and fifty cents per acre, or such other minimum price as is now fixed by law, or may be Limit to 160 fixed upon lands hereafter granted; and no one person shall have the

right of preëmption to more than one hundred and sixty acres: And Preëmption on provided further, That any settler who has settled or may hereafter set-French or Spa-tile on lands heretofore reserved on account of claims under French, Spa-nish claims denish, or other grants which have been or shall be hereafter declared by clared invalid. the Supreme Court of the United States to be invalid, shall be entitled to all the rights of preëmption granted by this act and the act of fourth of September, eighteen hundred and forty-one, entitled "An act to appropriate the proceeds of the public lands and to grant preemption rights," after the lands shall have been released from reservation, in the same manner as if no reservation existed.

CHAP. CXLIV. - An Act authorizing Changes in the Location of Land Offices.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United Location of States of America in Congress assembled, That the President be and he land offices may is hereby authorized to change the location of the land offices in the several land districts established by law, and to establish the same from time to time at such point in the district as he may deem expedient. APPROVED, March 3, 1853.
