

September 25, 1936 ---Meeting held at the Japanese Ass'n Hall

Mr. Hal Higashi reported on the progress of the County Fair Entertainment Committee, which was doing very nicely. The committee members, divided into three groups, gave their reports. Mr. Hal Higashi and Mr. Yoshio Tabata reported that the Messrs. Yoshida, talented instrumentalists from San Francisco were willing to perform.

Misses Yoshi Higuchi, Otsune Manaka, and Yoshiko Hattori reported that the ondos and odoris were being practiced. Due to a scarcity of girls on the peninsula to do the ondo they had asked the aid of the Salinas Valley JACL and as yet had received no definite answer.

Mr. Yoneo Gota reported that Mr. Hiroshi Yamamoto would kindly do the kenbu for us. Also they younger boys were to do the kendo.
