Gentlemen:

In compliance with the provisions of Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code I am pleased to submit the Monterey County Agricultural Crop Report for the calendar year of 1972.

Monterey County agriculture reached a record high of \$277,211,870 in 1972, which is an increase of 18 million over the previous year.

Growers were faced with severe drought and freezing conditions in the spring, record breaking freeze and prolonged rain toward the end of the year. These losses were off-set by demand and increased prices.

The values represented here are gross receipts received by the producers and do not take into account the costs of production, transportation or marketing. No attempt is made to reflect net income to the producer.

My thanks to the individuals and firms whose cooperation made this report possible, and to my staff, under the direction of Agricultural Inspector Don Rochester who coordinated and compiled this report.
