### Special Meeting

A special meeting was called to order by Mrs. Ogi for the purpose of discussing the cherry tree project and the lawn project.

A treasurer's report of \$257.85 was given. Jimmy Tabata ~~seconded~~ moved that the report be accepted. Yoshiko Hattori seconded it and the motion was carried.

Jimmy Tabata reported that sixty cherry trees were to be donated to the Monterey Union High School.

Discussion as to how to finance the trees was held. It was reported that the Japanese Students Club donated ten dollars (\$10.00) and that <sup>twenty</sup> students donated a dollar each totaling twenty-dollars (\$20.00). It was decided that each family with alumni donate \$1.00.

Apr. 10, was set for the formal presentation ceremony at the High School with the Mayor of Monterey present.

Iruo Esaki moved that the J.A.C.L. sponsor the cherry tree planting in conjunction with the Monterey Union High School Japanese Students Club. It was seconded by Mrs. Ogi. The motion was carried.



Concerning the Lawn Project, George Takagi asked the boys to help with the actual labor on Sunday Apr. 2. Miss Oeki Maunaka and Mrs. Ogi were appointed to take care of the luncheon for the helpers on Sunday.

George Takagi reported that approximately fifty dollars (\$50.00) maximum was the figure to finance the lawn project.

Discussion on ways and means of raising money was held. It was decided to leave this matter up to the Finance Board and then have it presented to the Assembly at large.

Masato Suyama suggested that in the near future to sponsor some sort of a get together party for the American friends interested in the Japanese, such as Capt. Georp and his wife, Mr. Mc Killop, etc. Tabled. -

In regards to the Anti-alien fishing bill, Hal Higashi reported that the Yorty Bill did not pass <sup>the committee</sup>. He also read a communication from the National President, Mr. Walter Fukamoto.
