[Brancroft does not list any Cosumnes rancho as being granted to Hartnell, although he does list a Cosumnes in Sacramento county, the claim for which was disallowed, but with no mention of Hartnell or de la Guerra. See BC iii.777 and 769 for biographical sketches of Hartnell and de la Guerra, respectively. Pablo de la Guerra was a brother-in-law of Hartnell, who married Guerra's sister, Maria Teresa de la Guerra.] "peciman Cases.... Hartnell, Todos Santos, Sta B., and Cosumnes, Sac....conf. by all the court. 1 Hoff. 207; 22 Howard, 286; but the Cosumnes cl. was cut down from 11 to 6 l. because the others was for 5 l. and only 11 l. in all could be granted to one man. H's rancho of Alisal 3/4 l., was not deducted because it was purchased not granted." [BC vi 553]
