Estudillo, who was the cl." [BC iv 621]. "Speciman Cases....S. Jacinto....conf. There were 2 ranchos and a sobrante of 5 l., 'more or less'. The latter was conf. for the full extent of 11 l., 1 Wallace, 311. Hayes Em. Notes, 448-52, an attorney in the case, explains how, in '66 et seq., the owners, by crooked surveys of the 3 ranchos, succeeded in stretching the sobrante across 12 miles of intervening space so as to include the tiné mines of Temescal."
