"Other names associated with its ownership were: John Frederick Romie, who came to California in 1841 and bought the rancho before he died in 1848; John C. Gore, who filed a claim for it on Febr. 9, 1853, which was rejected by the court; and David Jacks, whose name was substituted for that of Gore and to whom a patent. . .was given. . .That Gore actually lived on the land is proved by the map made by the survey of 1864, which shows the location of his house somewhere in the vicinity of the modern Pebble Beach."
