[BC iv 655] Hoover states in regard to Wilson: "he married Ramona Carillo de Pacheco, a widow with two sons, one of whom, Romualdo, afterward held many high offices in the state and became acting governor in 1875" [This is a question of this Romualdo and the Indian Romualdo, the grantee of this rancho and Romaldo referred to by Bancroft as a Neophyte Indian was and the same BMS] The Romualdo named as a son of Ramona Carillo de Pacheco not the same as the Romualdo, who was original grantee of this rancho.BMS]
