"Vasquez (Felipe)...grantee of Chamisal '35. iii 677." [BC v 760]. "Ranchos of Monterey district, 1831-40....Chamisal, 1 league, 1835, Felipe Vasquez, whose heirs were cl." [BC iii 677]. [Bancroft designates this rancho as one, the claim for which was disallowed. However, it was allowed and the patent issued to the heirs of Felipe Vasquez. It may be that the L. C. disallowed it and that the courts later reversed this decision a fact that did not get into BC. EMS].
