"Gómez (Vicente Perfecto)...He was also unsuccessful claimant for Tucho. iv 656." [BC iii 759]. [V. Gómez claim to this rancho was disallowed and the patent issued to David Jacks.]. "It [El Tucho] was in the heart of the Blanco country where the Portolá expedition of 1769 had maintained a base camp during the first week of October, while scouts were endeavoring to find the Port of Monterey, the objective of the journey."
