Ulistac (Sta Clara), 1/2 l., Marcelo Pico and Cristobal; J. D. Hoppe, cl..." [BC iv 674] [It is hard to determine here whether there were two or three grantees. The archives give three, with names of Marcelo, Pio and Cristobal, whereas BC assumes that Marcelo was the first name of Pico or Pio. BMS] and H. and H. Drake index
