"Many of the ancient canals and dams built by the Fathers for irrigating their orchards and crops may still be seen in the vicinity of the Mission. . . Fire almost destroyed the establishment in 1806. . . The church building which was begun in 1816 and completed in 1818 still stands. . . San Miguel remains more unspoiled by restoration than any of the other missions and contains perhaps the finest examples of the original decorations done by Indians under the supervision of the padres.
