"Narvaez (Pedro)...in '44 grantee of Paso de Robles. iv 655." [BC 717.752]. i "Rios (Petronillo)...in '52 claimant for Paso de Robles iv 655." [BC v. 696]. "List of private ranchos granted in 1841-5....Paso de Robles (S. Luis Ob.) 6 l., 1844, Pedro Narvaez; P. Rios, cl." [BC iv 655].

Received its name from the presence of numerous large white oaks which dotted the valley. The hot springs on the rancho were known to the Indians and possibly used by the Franciscan Friars as early as 1797. Petronillo Rios sold the rancho to Daniel D. and James H. Blackburn in 1857 and Lazare Godchaux. James Drury, brother-in-law of the Blackburns purchased the hot springs tract along the west bank of the river where the town of Paso Robles now stands [Hoover]
