ADDITIONAL DATA (See also back of sheet) Mission first established in the banks of the Río Guadalupe, called by the Indians So-co-is-u-ka, meaning "laurel-wood". The swollen river caused the church to be flooded twice within the next two years and the fathers moved the church to higher ground. "the building erected on this spot is said to have been one of the most elaborate and beautiful of all the Mission structures in California. It was begun Nov. 9, 1781, and was dedicated by Father Serra on May 15, 1784. . .Some of the old adobe inclosure remains today. . .The earthquakes of 1812 and 1818, however, caused such serious damage to the buildings that the Fathers were obliged to move again.
