"Soberanes (Mariano)...grantee of S. Bernardo in '41 -- though this may have been his father. iv 655." [BC v 726]. "List of private ranchos granted 1841-5....S. Bernardo, 3 leagues, Mariano Soberanes, who was cl." [BC iv 655]. [Bancroft makes no mention of Juan Soberanes as being the grantee of any rancho. However Mariano Soberanes, the grantee of Los Ojitos had two sons named Mariano and Juan, Mariano being the older by two years. It is probably that these two sons were the grantees of this rancho.] [Hoover states that this grant was made to Juan and Mariano Soberanes] "San Ardo, a station on the Southern Pacific Railway, is about midway of the long narrow tract. The property was owned by M. Brandenstein at the time of the purchase of the rights of way for the road, and as a result of stipulations made by him every train that is flagged must stop at this small village." [H]
