"Ranchos of Monterey district, 1831-40...Noche Buena (Huerta de la Nacion ?), 1 1., 1835, José Ant. Muñoz; José and Jaime de Puig Monmany (?) cl." [BC iii 678]. [In his Pioneer Index Bancroft does not mention José Ant. Muñoz as being the grantee of any ranchos.]. The year after this grant was made the grantee was exiled with Gutiérrez. "In March 1853, José Monomany and Jaime de Rinz Monomany filed a claim for the property and in 1854, five-sixths of it was confirmed to them. The other sixth was held for José Muñoz infant heir of the original grantee. [Hoover]
