Name "Capay" of Indian origin. Wintun Indian for "stream" [IC]

"Soto (Josefa)....grantee of Capay rancho '35-44. iii 711. iv 671." [BC v 728]. "Ranchos of S. Francisco district....Capay (Tehama), 5 l., 1835 (1845 ?), Josefa Soto; P. B. Reading cl. "[BC iii 711. [Bancroft list this grant as being disallowed. He does not seem to be sure of the date of the grant and indicates that the date of it might have been 1845 instead of 1835. It is possible that Reading claimed half of the rancho under some color of title, but that his claim was disallowed by the L. C.]. "Ranchos of northern Cal., granted in 1841-5....Capay (Colusa) [at one time this rancho was located in Colusa Co., until the formation of Glenn and Tehama Cos.]. 10 l., 1844, Josefa Soto, who was cl." [BC iv 671]
