"Yorba (Bernardo)...grantee of Cañada de Santa Ana '34...iii 633." [BC v 782]. See this reference for biographical sketch of grantee. "Ranchos of the Los Angeles district 1831-40....Cañada de Sta Ana, 3 l., granted in 1834 to Bernardo Yorba who was cl." [BC iii 633]. The most important rancho house in Orange county during the mexican period was built by Bernardo Yorba, one of California's greatest land owners, on Rancho Cañon de Santa Ana on the north bank of the Santa Ana river. It was one of the greatest rancho houses in California. An effort to have it restored a few years ago failed and the walls were razed so that nothing remains of this adobe. [Rensch]
