"Castro (Mariano)...in 1801 went to Mex. and obtained a grant of La Brea, or Las Animas rancho in Santa Clara Co., about which he had considerable trouble later, though the grant was confirmed in '35. ii 7, 163, 163, 171, 594..."[BC ii 754].

"At San Juan Bautista there was a controversy about lands in 1803. Mariano Castro had gone to Mexico two years before, and had come back as a poblador in 1802, with permission to occupy the rancho of La Brea, where he made some improvements. But the friars refused to remove their live stock, and sent in a protest to the president from whom it went to
