"Soberanes (Mariano)...In '42 he was grantee of Los Ojitos rancho. iv 655....He was cl. for Los Ojitos in '52 and the rancho is still owned by his sons in '85." [BC v 726]. List of private ranchos granted in 1841-5...Ojitos, 2 leagues, 1842, Mariano Soberanes, who was cl. [BC iv 655]. "Rancho Los Ojitos. . .adjoining the southern tip of Rancho Las Milpitas, is a long narrow strip of land lying along the San Antonio River. A few hills and canyons are in its south central part, but in the main it is composed of bottom land. . . Because the grantee had been active against the American invaders, the place was pillaged by Frémont's men on their way to Los Angeles. . .In 1860 the Roth family became the owners of part of the rancho, that that part is still held by descendents of that family [Hoover]
