 "Ranchos of S. Francisco district....Laguna de la Merced (San Mateo and S. F.). 1 1/2 leagues, 1835, José Ant. Galindo, Josefa de Haro et al cl." [BC iii 712]. On May 12, 1937 Francisco de Haro purchased this rancho from Galindo for one hundred cows and \$25.00 in goods. In 1838 de Haro as alcalde in San Francisco, charged with the guardianship of people who violated the law faced a problem when Galindo the former owner of this rancho was taken into custody for the murder of José Peralta [H].
