"Dominguez (José Ant.). . .grantee of San Emigdio '42. iv 635." [BC ii 782]. "Dominguez (Francisco). . .cl. for San Emigdio rancho. Son of José Ant." [BC ii 782]. "Ranchos of Los Angeles district 1841-5. . .S. Emigdio, 4 l., 1842, José Antonio Dominguez; F. Dominguez et al.cl." [BC iv 635]. According to GK, Francisco Dominguez filed a claim for all of this rancho although he had deeded away all his right, title, and interest in it for \$400.00, and his claim was disallowed by the l.c. and the title confirmed to John C. Frémont and the Heirs at law of José Ant. Dominguez. RH states that José Ant. Dominguez died in 1843 or '44 and that his widow, Francisca Villa Dominguez inherited the rancho; that she did not live there and on Nov. 29, 1851, John C. Fremont bought a half interest in it.
