Name "Omochumnes" of Indian origin. Miwok Indian for "people of Umucha" [IC]

ADDITIONAL DATA (See also back of sheet)

"Sheldon (Jared)...in '44 grantee of the Omochumne rancho on the Cosumnes. iv 672; where he was the partner of Wm. Daylor. "[BC v 718]. "Ranchos of northern Cal. grante in 1841-5... Omochumne (Sac), 5 l., 1844, Joaquin Sheldon, whose heirs were cl." [BC iv 672]. [In the Pioneer Index, Bancroft gives the name of this grantee as "Jared", but in the history text it is given as "Joaquin", the latter name undoubtedly being the correct one.] [as this is also the name used in the archives and the Drake Index]. Sheldon and Daylor, who both worked for Sutter were partners on this rancho. Sheldon was to get the grant as he had become a naturalized Mexican citizen and held claims against the government for services in building the customs house at Monterey. He was also to furnish the cattle. Daylor was to settle on the ranch and look after the stock. [RH]
