"According to a mission report of 1828 there were two ranchos down the river between
San Gabriel and San Pedro; one occupied by the widow Sotelo ~~already mentioned~~, and the
other that of Antonio Maria Lugo already mentioned. The tract called Sausal Redondo was
temporarily granted by the commandant of Santa Barbara in 1822 to Antonio Ignacio
