

Now Know Ye, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises and pursuant to the provisions of the Act of Congress aforesaid of 3^d March, 1851, and the legislation supplemental thereto, Have Given and Granted, and by their presents Do Give and Grant, unto the said John Wilson and to his heirs, the tract of land embraced and described in the foregoing survey, but with the stipulation that in virtue of the 16th Section of the said Act, the confirmation of this said claim and this patent, shall not affect the interests of third persons.

So Have and So Hold the said tract with the appurtenances unto the said John Wilson and to his heirs and assigns forever with the stipulation aforesaid.

In Testimony Whereof, I, Myself, S. Grant, President of the United States, have caused these Letters to be made Patent and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand at the City of Washington this thirteenth day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one and of the Independence of the United States the ninety-fifth.
