









Now Know Ye, that the United States of America in consideration of the premises and pursuant to the provisions of the Act of Congress aforesaid of 3d March, 1851, and the legislation supplemental thereto, Have Given and Granted and by these presents Do Give and Grant unto the said D. S. Gregory and E. L. Williams and to their heirs the tract of land embraced and described in the foregoing survey: but with the stipulation, that, in virtue of the 15th Section of the said Act, neither the confirmation of this said claim nor this patent shall affect the interests of third persons.

To Have and To Hold the said Tract with the appurtenances unto the said D. S. Gregory and E. L. Williams, and to their heirs and assigns forever, with the stipulation aforesaid.

In Testimony Whereof, I, Ulysses S. Grant, President of the United States, have caused these Letters to be made Patent and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
