"Cota (Francisco)...grantee of Sta Rosa '39. iii 656;...His widow and cl. for the rancho '52 was María Jesús Olivera..." [BC ii 769]. "Private ranchos of Sta Barbara district (included with those of Los Angeles in earlier decades)...Santa Rosa, 3 1/2 l., 1839, Francisco; M. J. Olivera de Cota cl." [BC iii 656] [Apparently the original size of this grant as given by Bancroft is the more correct as the acreage patented equals approximately 3 1/2 leagues. It may be that the archive record shows only the amount of land in the first grant and the second grant may have included additional acreage. BMS]
