"Larios (Justo). . .grantee of Cañada de los Capitancillos in '42. iv 671." [BC iv 705].  
 "Ranchos of northern Cal., granted in 1841-5. . .Capitancillos, Cañada, 1842, Justo Larios; Guadalupe Min. Co. cl. Fossat's claim rejected" [BC iv 671]. [This was about 1/4 of the original rancho, and for which a claim by Fossat (if such a claim was filed) was not allowed. However the balance of the rancho known as "Los Capitancillos" [#194] was patented to Charles Fossat. Bancroft fails to mention this latter fact. The Los Captancillos was the rancho upon which the New Almaden mine was located. This mine was the subject of controversy for years between the owners of that rancho and San Vicente [Berreyesa] # 195. Cañada de los Capitancillos was not involved in the dispute. BMS] Hoover states as follows: "A part of his [Larios] land

through which Los Capitancillos Creek flows was patented as Rancho Capitancillos (3,360.48) acres to Charles Fossat on February 3, 1865. A lesser part, Cañada de los Capitancillos, containing 1,109.67 acres, was patented to the Guadalupe Mining Company [not the mining company involved in the New Almaden dispute] on Oct. 14, 1864. This company developed the Guadalupe mine two miles beyond the New Almaden; while it has not had the spectacular career of the latter, the Guadalupe is still producing."
