"Lataillade (Cesario)....the grantee of Cuyamas rancho in '46. v 632." [BC iv 708]. "Private ranchos....Cuyama, 11 sq. leagues, 1846, Cesario Lataillade; whose widow was cl." [BC v 632] [Bancroft list this rancho was one of those for which the claim was disallowed. However the archives show the claim to have eventually been allowed, probably by the courts, and the patent issued to the heirs of Cesario Lataillade. BMS]
