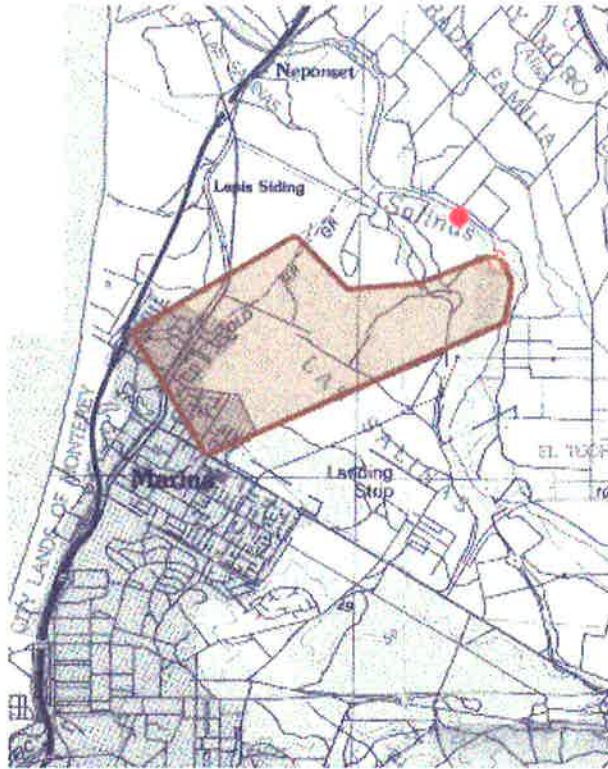

Notice is hereby given, that we, J. G. Armstrong, J. A. Armstrong, E. A. Armstrong and  
E. C. Armstrong, all of Monterey County, California, do hereby claim the water flowing  
in this river, known as the Salinas River, in Monterey County, California to the extent  
of One Thousand (1000) inches measured under a four inch pressure. That we intend to  
divert the same at a point in said river near where the said river enters upon  
Lot 4 of the Las Salinas Rancho as subdivided by James Bardin Sr. the said point  
being the southeasterly portion of said Lot 4 of the Las Salinas Rancho and owned by  
us. That we claim said water for the purposes of irrigation of lands, for agricultural  
and horticultural purposes, now owned by us in the Las Salinas Rancho in said  
Monterey County, or lands that may be hereafter acquired by us in that locality,  
also for the purpose of watering stock, household and dairy purposes on said  
lands, and for the purposes of irrigation and watering stock on other lands in that  
vicinity. That we intend to divert said water by means of a pump, flume,  
pipe and ditch of the following dimensions: The flume to be 18 inches wide  
and 17 inches deep; the ditch 3 feet wide at the bottom, 4 feet wide at the  
top and 2 feet deep, and the pipe 10 inches in diameter. We also claim the  
right to change the place of diversion and to reconstruct or enlarge the flume,
