

Fort Ord Yearbooks - Frequently Asked Questions

Do you have a copy of my yearbook?

The collection of Fort Ord yearbooks at the Archives & Special Collections at CSUMB represents only a very small portion of the thousands of books that were published over the years. All of the books stored in the archives have been digitized and uploaded to our repository. If you do not see the book you are looking for on [Digital Commons](#), it is not part of the library's collection.

Where else can I find Fort Ord yearbooks that have been digitized?

[The Command History Office](#) at the Defense Language Institute Foreign Language Center (DLIFLC) has a limited number of training unit books available to view and download.

Can I buy a yearbook from CSUMB Library?

The Fort Ord yearbooks owned by Archives & Special Collections are not for sale. If you are looking to purchase a book, they can sometimes be found on ebay, AbeBooks, and other online book retailers. We are not aware of any company or organization that has a comprehensive collection of Fort Ord books for sale.

Can I donate my yearbook?

The yearbooks were published by a variety of independent publishers contracted by the U.S. Army for different periods of time. We do not have information related to the individual publishers.

Where can I find photographs and personnel records of my family member who was stationed at Fort Ord?

Archives & Special Collections does not have access to military records, and our collection of photographs is limited to [historical](#) and [post-closure](#) images.
